Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you and your families continue to be well and are starting to enjoy the gradual lowering of restrictions, as well as looking forward to a break over the Easter period.

We will be breaking up on Maundy Thursday, 1st April, at approximately 12:45pm. If your child is on free school meals and would like to order a packed lunch to take home, please ask them to see Mrs Gorman in the kitchen before the end of lunchtime on Wednesday. A selection of snacks will also be available at breaktime. Students will be able to wear non-uniform that day and are asked to make a contribution of £1 towards St Joseph's Penny, the Salford Diocese charity we often support at this time of year. A socially distanced Mass is taking place next Tuesday at 8:25am in the school hall with Father Kieren. All students are welcome to attend. There is still time to order a personalised Easter Bunny (see picture below) from Ms Nadeem (m.nadeem@st-antonys.com). These are £3 each and all monies raised also go to this charity.

In school mass testing has now ended and all those students for whom we had consent have now been provided with home testing kits. Testing should continue over the Easter break and further kits will be distributed next week once we receive delivery in school.
