Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you and your families continue to be well, have managed to enjoy some of this recent glorious weather and are looking forward to the upcoming long Bank Holiday weekend. It's been four weeks since my last letter and we have had a very busy and exciting first two weeks of term. Due to the growth of the school, we are delighted to have been able to appoint a number of new teachers who will join us in September. We are particularly pleased to be expanding our languages offer with the addition of Spanish, which will form part of the KS3 curriculum for Years 7 and 8.

You will be very aware, I'm sure, of all the talk in the media about catch up and recovery. We have been delighted with the attitude and efforts of the students as they returned last month and we wish to build on this by bringing forward the new academic year to start in June after we return from the half term break. This will impact positively on all year groups but especially on the current Year 9s who will start then with their option choices. There will also be some changes to the finish times of the school day with KS3 classes finishing at 3:10pm and KS4 at 3:15pm.

Testing continues to play a crucial role in the fight against coronavirus. Students should continue to test themselves twice a week and report their results. The email address for the sharing of results with school is CovidTesting@st-antonys.com. **If a child tests positive, please call school immediately or email f.wright@st-antonys.com.** The DfE have produced a blog on [why reporting your test result is as important as taking a test](#), featuring further guidance and common questions. This also includes details on financial support available to parents whose children are asked to self-isolate after contact with a positive case.

We have had one positive case in Year 11 since our return, and another in Year 10. The Year 10 student tested positive in a home test (which was later confirmed with a PCR test) and was able to isolate himself before he came into contact with any other student, thus minimising the impact on both the health and education of others. Thank you all for your continued support with this.

As the weather improves and the restrictions continue to reduce, we are looking forward to restarting some of our extra-curricular activities. A popular wellbeing activity is our walks through Urmston meadows and along the River Mersey. We hope to be able to reintroduce these soon so, if you haven't already given permission for your child to participate (or aren't sure if you have or not), please email c.mortell@st-antonys.com to do so. It's a wonderful way to spend an hour or so.
