Course Content:

Skills needed and developed:

Assessment Methods:

You will be assessed in all 4 skill areas:

- 1. Listening: exam at the end of Year 11. 25%
- 2. Reading: exam at the end of Year 11. 25%
- 3. Speaking: exam at the end of Year 11. 25%
- 4. Writing: exam at the end of Year 11. 25%

Qualification gained at completion of the course:

GCSE French at grade 9-1.
