ABOUT US

The Children's Book Project is a national charity that believes every child should have access to good quality, exciting and relevant books. We'd like every child to feel part of a wider reading community and to draw inspiration and pleasure from words and pictures.

We work with schools across the UK to match families whose children have grown out of their books with communities that have fewer books of their own. In turn, we invite practitioners in these settings to use these books in whichever way(s) will have greatest benefit to the children and young people they support.

YOUR SCHOOL IS ON THE MAP

Your school has been added to our national map of settings that would like to receive books for their community. Local families can click on your school icon to register and then bring the books to your reception during school hours. We strongly encourage you to brief front office staff so that anyone arriving to donate is welcomed by someone familiar with the initiative.

Families that bring books to your school may have travelled some way and / or may be passing on books that are important to them. If possible, try to ensure they are thanked.





BRIEF ALL STAFF

Tell your colleagues about the school's plan to take in donations of good quality books that can be used to augment the library offer, classroom corners or to put on book gifting events. Show them the website, the map and how to find your school.

Staff will want to promote amongst their friends and will help your programme to generate momentum. Included in this pack are resources that you can use in the front office and staffroom to ensure staff remain aware of the school's involvement.



MAKE A PLAN FOR ANY DONATED BOOKS

Use the ideas on the following page and talk to colleagues to plan how books could be most useful for the school. Consider plans for 50+ books and for larger volume donations. You might want to store books as they are donated and do something with a larger volume once collected, or use them as they arrive.

Plan where you will store donated books and who can help sort through donations. Make time to weed out any unwanted books and consider where these will go.



LAUNCH TO PARENTS AND THE COMMUNITY

Use the school newsletter to share the initiative with parents and governors and encourage them to share onwards. This alone will drive donations, though remember to stress the importance of good condition books.
