Mock Interview day for Y11 took place on 8th December, with 20 volunteers from Further Education or Industry interviewing our wonderfully smart, professional Y11s. The visitors were very impressed with the event at St Antony's and with the standard of Y11 in terms of work appearance, quality of the responses to questions and maturity in the interviews. Y11 found the day of benefit and "feel more prepared for future interviews and more confident about interviewing abilities". They also stated that "the interviewer was nice" and that the visitors supportive in giving immediate verbal feedback as well as personalised, written feedback shared with Y11 via form tutors afterwards. We hope that many of the same visitors will support us with our plans for Careers events for other year groups in 2024, including many local employers, such as Trafford Council, Octopus Energy and Soreen.
