An opportunity to share a working lunch with a Paralegal, who explained her work and her route to it.




An offer of some post-16 application support from the Growth Company in a lunchtime drop-in.

The Growth Company and Salford City College have both presented to Y11 in assembly about post-16 pathways, the last of such events for Y11. It was the final, graduation visit for some Y11s to the University of Manchester Gateways programme, as part of their annual visit in secondary school.

And the Greater Manchester Higher Programme, in partnership with Loreto Sixth Form, has seen some Y11s graduate too – it aims to encourage the highest academic aspirations for young people.

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Y9

Using the feedback from student surveys sent out by Mrs Williams, several of our Y9s were able to spend a morning at an NHS event, where a range of employment opportunities within the NHS were explored.







Y9, Y10 & Y11 A Human Rights Judge presented to Y10 and Y11 about her work. And while Y11 were afforded the opportunity to drop in to speak to a Human Rights Lawyer over lunchtime, Y9 were able to hear from her in a Careers Workshop, investigating different court cases to see which protected characteristics had been discriminated against by their place of work or employer.

She also offers drop-ins over Monday lunchtimes for any student of any year group.


Other St Antony's Stories
