## **MFL**

Mrs Stevens took a group of Year 10 French pupils to the University of Manchester for a day called Insights into Languages. The pupils were able to spend time with University students who are "living the dream", having just returned from their year spent abroad in countries including Brazil, La Reunion and Mexico! The pupils were given a tour of the campus in the morning and then they did some audio subtitling in the same way that they do for TV programmes. Later in the day, they were treated to a session during which they learned to speak some Russian!

This year we were very excited to take part in a Spanish student exchange where we welcomed students from Spain to stay with host families from St. Antony's. The Spanish students followed the English buddy's timetable and got to experience UK life and our great British summer. Students are paired considering their age and interests so that new friendships and life changing experiences can happen. As well as attending classes they also got to come on the Blackpool trip which was an amazing opportunity for them.

We are very much looking forward to taking part again next year when our English buddies will have the chance to travel back to Spain for the last week in July to stay with their Spanish buddy.

## Geography



The Eco Club continued to their hard work in improving the environment around school and thinking of ways we can all be environmentally active in our communities. This will be further developed in 2024-5 with some great plans in place. We maintain our Green Flag which flies proudly outside our school.

Our Y10 Geographers battled against the elements and completed their first piece of fieldwork locally in Salford Quays and Old Trafford where they assessed the risks posed in our communities to crime and traffic.



## **CCF**



The cadets have enjoyed lots of trips this term. We have been to Sale Water Park, Southport, and, most recently, Portsmouth.

Whilst in Portsmouth the cadets were able to take part in firefighting training, as well as going into the DRIU (damage repair instructional unit) - both of which are things that the Navy do as part of their training!

In the firefighting training, the cadets were able to try on the firefighting equipment and put out lots of different types of

fires. We saw a (controlled!) fire that we measured at 800 degrees Celsius! In the afternoon, we went to the DRIU, which simulates a ship sinking and filling with water. The cadets had to 'save the ship' using wooden blocks, which they hammered into the holes. This required the cadets to work together, and also meant they got very wet!

Everyone had a fantastic experience and are already looking forward to next year!





## **Reading and Literacy**



This has been a marvellous year for the library and literacy teams, as we have grown our library, increased numbers of books on loan every term and celebrated a range of events such as World Book Day, Black History Month and even the Euros! Our support for those who find reading most challenging has been celebrated by Ofsted and we have seen it have a profound effect on our pupils. Reading changes lives!

We want to continue to raise the numbers of young people reading in and out of school and we want our parents and carers to help with this. Please encourage your children to read at home and to come to our library if they need inspiration. Mrs Bolton and Mr Williams will be more than happy to help!

#### **Homework**

The new homework strategy introduced this year has been hugely successful and pupils have been working very hard on this. This hard work has led to improved knowledge retention over time, which has been demonstrated in recent assessments. The 5-year, structured revision programme continues to improve with subject leaders refining homework based on feedback from pupils, parents and teachers so that homework is even better next year. Years 7-9 continue to use booklets containing knowledge organisers with matching questions, Y10 utilise revision guides with accompanying question booklets and Y11 use the same revision guides with matching exam practice workbooks to help them prepare for success in their exams. There will soon be a new section on the website where you can access homework information for all year groups, including the KS3 homework booklets.

## **Catholic Life**

Following the tremendous success of our St Antony's Feast Day walk fundraiser, we are thrilled to announce that our pupils raised over £1200. This incredible achievement has contributed to our total fundraising efforts of over £5000 for various charities throughout the year.

Recently, the GIFT Team had the honour of reading at mass, where pupils who have demonstrated dedication to Catholic life were acknowledged with awards. Congratulations to Alona Citto and Ahina Anna on receiving the Caritas Award.

Looking ahead, the team is already hard at work preparing for the upcoming year of service and compassion within our school community. Exciting plans include organising the Big Sleep Out, conducting a food appeal, leading prayers, and hosting small chapel services. creative career and hosted a thrilling 'Dragon's Den' activity. The Young Engineers captivated the students with a hands-on LEGO and moving mechanisms workshop. Additionally, a pastry chef dazzled everyone with live culinary demonstrations, and an artist who collaborated with JD showcased his innovative digital trainer designs. Our students thoroughly enjoyed the day, finding it both enjoyable and immensely beneficial to their learning.

## **Sports**



The PE department have had another very busy Summer term. The Trafford Cricket league started after the Easter holidays and our teams' played games against other Trafford schools, noticeably performances being the Year 8/9 team beating Lostock High.

As part of the PE department's co-curricular offer, the Year 9 pupils spent a day working with the British Army completing their 'Skills

For Life' course. The course is designed to test the physical and mental capabilities of pupils with the aim of improving their teamwork, communication and problem solving skills.

The Year 10 GCSE PE pupils have been to the Parthian climbing centre for 3 days of indoor climbing, learning the core and advanced skills ahead of their final Climbing assessment. The assessment scores will form 10% of their final GCSE PE grade.

We are all looking forward to our annual Sports day event due to take place on Thursday 18th July in school. This will provide every pupil the opportunity to showcase their sporting prowess in either a traditional or non-traditional Athletics event.

## Rewards





Over this academic year we have revamped our rewards strategy to ensure that all students who demonstrate our school values, go above and beyond with their work and make a positive contribution to the St Antony's community can be rewarded. Students have been rewarded in a variety of ways such as with achievement points, hot chocolate mornings, reward trips, subject awards, heads of year awards, positive postcards, positive phone calls home, shout outs in assemblies amongst many other things.

This term 350 students were taken to Blackpool Pleasure Beach for having outstanding behaviour in school and excellent attendance across term 3 of this academic year.

We have ended our school year with our year group rewards ceremonies. These ceremonies have allowed students, parents and carers to get together to celebrate the successes of our students. There have been rewards for attainment, progress and attitude to learning in all subject areas, plus additional special recognition awards from heads of year and the head teacher. This has involved over 40 awards per year group!

We want students to understand that if they act in a positive way, they will be rewarded for this. So far this year, our students have earned a total of **159,032 achievement points**. That works out to an average of **228** per person!

Next year there will be further chances to reward our amazing students for their outstanding effort and contribution to our school community.
