
Reasons to choose St Antony's Roman Catholic School

British Values & Our Catholic Ethos

The promotion of 'British values' is central to Catholic education at St Antony's because British values have their origin in the Christian values of our nation. St Antony's is a Catholic school which actively promotes tolerance, forgiveness and reconciliation. Our mission and whole school values encourage inclusivity and respect.

Christ is the centre of all that we do in our learning, in our leisure and in our worship, this is reflected in all areas of school life.





Transition and Support

We pride ourselves on working in partnership with families and primary schools to ensure that a students' transition to us is a positive experience. We hold a number of events before children join us to ensure that they feel comfortable and enthused. This includes open evenings, new parents'/carers' evenings and transition days. We attend a number of events at local primary schools too. We welcome you to arrange a personal tour of the school at any stage and understand that, for some students, this might be a number of visits to ease them into the school.

In Year 7

We work hard to ensure that your child settles quickly into Year 7 and makes friends quickly. In the first few weeks of induction, students will spend time finding their way round the school, joining extracurricular classes and getting to know their form group. We offer pastoral support to those students who need some extra help and our school Student Leadership Team and Peer Mentors support the process of new students settling into school life.





Learning Support

At St Antony's we adhere to three main principles to ensure that all students can access a broad and balanced curriculum and have an equal opportunity to receive an education that is appropriate to their individual needs by:

Setting suitable learning challenges

We work to give every student the opportunity to experience success in learning and to achieve as high-a-standard as possible by appropriate intervention and support.

Responding to students diverse learning needs

When we plan our lessons, we take into account the different backgrounds, experiences, interests and strengths which influence the way in which students learn.

Overcoming potential barriers to learning and assessment

Although it is important to note St Antony's is a mainstream offer without the specialist SEND provision that other schools might have, we recognise that a minority of students will have particular learning and assessment requirements and we do our very best to address them by making reasonable adjustments to our support during lesson time and examination time (if appropriate).



How do we do this?

Where appropriate, our team of Learning Support Assistants will work with students mostly in the classroom environment and occasionally in small groups or on a one-to-one basis. This support can take many forms including inside and outside of the classroom help. We welcome you to discuss this with us personally so that we can build the appropriate support for your child.

High Expectations

Everyone has very high expectations of each other at St Antony's. Students will be pushed so they are given every opportunity to fulfil their academic potential.

Attendance

It is essential for confidence and continuity that students have high levels of attendance. We will work closely with families to try to reduce all the possible barriers that might prevent children coming to school.







Our students really value the extra-curricular activities that are on offer during lunch-time and after the school day. These clubs enable our students to gain new skills, take part in their favourite sport, develop a wider group of friends and have fun. The Duke of Edinburgh Award and the Combined Cadet Force offer a great opportunity for all students to get external recognition for their skills and these awards are considered favourably by colleges and employers. The weekly activities are delivered by our staff or external experts and will vary from time-to-time as we try to meet the interests of our students. Families will get invited to see musical events and performances and to watch sporting events throughout the year.

Trips and Visits

Students will regularly get the opportunity to go on curriculum trips and visits to support their learning. Additionally, we take students overseas and to places that they might not have been before in this country.





School Buses

There are two services that are specifically for our school students. These bring students directly to the school and take the same journey back at the end of the day. These are operated by external providers and take the following routes.

Service 785 route: From Hulme, Royce Road/City Road via City Road, Northumberland Road, Ayres Road, Seymour Grove, Kings Road, Great Stone Road, Chester Road, Davyhulme Road East, Moss Road, Derbyshire Lane, Barton Road, Chatsworth Road, Winchester Road, Moss Vale Road, Bradfield Road to St Antony's Roman Catholic School.

Service 786 route: From Flixton, Towns Gate via Irlam Road, Woodsend Crescent Road, Moorside Road, Winchester Road, Moss Vale Road, Bradfield Road to St Antony's Roman Catholic School.

Cycling to School

We have a bicycle shelter which is locked each morning and opened again at the end of the school day. Students are encouraged to cycle to school to benefit their health and fitness and to be more green.
