Dear Parish Family,

I was recently listening to a Radio 4 programme commenting on the, new TV adaptation of the fictional Hilary Mantel novel (The Mirror & the Light) - please note that all her books on Thomas Cromwell are completely inaccurate - I would rather trust Wikipedia!

One of the commentators (a real historian) pointed out how dangerous it would have been to live during the reign of Henry, where the whim an immortality of one man, could not only destroy the Church; but cost you your life.

We may be fascinated by the Tudors and a particular for of monarchy; but we wouldn't really want to be governed by them.

Jesus, is often understood in Royal terms, and many Christians find this uncomfortable.

However, on this feast we are invited, as we look towards Christ, to contemplate true sovereignty. Jesus is revealed as King, not of a country or an earthly realm, but of the Universe, He is King of all that is; and yet He is King in the most un-royal way.

He turned away from power and wealth, and yet He gathered crowds around Himself; He drew the poor, oppressed and outcast, and He taught with true authority, an authority that came not from royal birth and station, but from God Himself, and revealed, through action of the Incarnate One. No wonder, that when our King spoke those who heard were astounded.

And yet, so few chose to follow Him, just as today so few who call Him King, chose to make His Kingdom real today.

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS

If you live in Trafford and your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021, they are eligible to start school from 1 September 2025. You must apply to Trafford for all your preferred schools, including schools in other local authority areas. <u>The</u> <u>closing date for primary school</u> <u>applications is 15 January 2025</u>.

THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION EUCHARIST & CONFIRMATION



EUCHARIST (HOLY COMMUNION)

The Eucharist is the source and summit of all Christian life, the Eucharist is not a thing or a holy object, the Eucharist is the gift of God Himself given and shared with us.

All parent's of children who will be entering Yr 3 (in September 2024) will be invited from the beginning of May 2024 to enrol their children on the Sacramental Programme. All children must be baptised in the Catholic Church and families **WILL** be expected, to do what all Catholic families should already be doing, that is attend Sunday Mass.



CONFIRMATION All details will be published in the newsletter and a notice will be sent to our local Diocesan Catholic Secondary School (St. Antony's) and those schools that are in the Diocese of Shrewsbury (BTH, St. Ambrose & Loreto). Registering an interest is **not** joining the pro-

gramme, and as the child enters Yr8 (Sept 2024) they will have to make the commitment to participate on the programme and complete the sacraments of initiation. Please not that although information is sent to High Schools outside the Diocese of Salford and the non-Catholic schools in the area, distribution of information is dependent upon the cooperation of the Head teacher and Head of RE.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Code of Canon Law states: "Parents are obliged to see to it that infants are baptised within the first weeks after birth" (867)

As a Parish, we follow the Diocesan Baptism Policy

In order for your baby/child (under the age of 7) to be baptised, if you are not already practising your Catholic faith, then you must begin to **attend Sunday Mass for a minimum of at least 6 weeks** before a baptism date can be discussed.

- If you live outside the Parish, but this Parish is your place of *regular* worship, no permission is needed.
- If you live outside the Parish and don't regularly attend Mass, permission from your Parish Priest is needed.
- After a date for baptism has been set, a meeting with Fr. Kieren or Deacon John must be arranged (by you).
- If your child is over 7 they must be treated as an adult and must follow an adapted RCIA programme.
