






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

At the event, delegates could network with others determined to drive change and help the city-region meet its ambitious goals for the environment, with panels, workshops, networking and exhibition stands showcasing challenges, solutions and opportunities. Our students got to have a one-to-one session with Mr Burnham to discuss green issues, including Green Industries and his plans for the future of Greater Manchester.



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While a variety of employers and post-16 providers were here on site, **Y9 students** were able to attend a **Careers Fair**, rotating round to talk to the visitors about their work, the things expected of them at work, how they started in that line of employment etc. This is the first time that this event has been run for Y9 and we were thrilled at how engaged the students were, asking some great questions and ensuring that they found out a little bit more about the world of work.


**The Big Sing** is now something we have been involved with for a couple of years — this year was even bigger and better than last.

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And as part of our work for this, we were also blessed to be joined by some of **our partner primary schools** in a festive celebration here at school, this time with **students from Y7**. What a joy!




