

Subject: Upcoming KS3 assessments

Dear parent/carer,

Your child has three knowledge organiser assessments a year in each subject. These take place in the Autumn, Spring and Summer terms. **The second assessment window is Monday 27th January to Friday 7th February**. Your child will sit a knowledge organiser assessment for each of their subjects during this two-week period.

The purpose of the assessments is to find out what your child knows and can remember. This helps your child and their teachers know what they are doing well and what they can improve. It is also an opportunity for your child to practise completing assessments so they feel easier. Each knowledge organiser assessment is focussed on the essential knowledge studied in lessons and homework. Roughly 50% of each assessment is on learning from lessons, with the other 50% on homework.

To help your child prepare for the assessments, and to help them develop their revision skills, they have a session during form about how to revise, along with guidance and time to prepare a revision timetable. During the first week in January, they will also be given a booklet containing information on:

- Achievement Why it is important? How do I achieve well?
- What assessments do I have?
- How do I prepare properly?
- What do I revise? (This states what is on the assessments)
- How do I revise?
- How do I revise independently?
- Revision using online platforms Includes Seneca class codes
- Revising effectively
- How to make a revision plan
- Revision timetable (This is your child's own plan)
- Useful websites/apps

Please discuss the upcoming assessments with your child and support them with preparing effectively by helping them organise their revision time. They should be using their knowledge organisers from their homework and lessons to help them prepare. Revision ideas are in the booklet.
