Dear Parishioners,

I'm going to focus on Ash Wednesday on Wednesday, but in this reflection I would like to focus on the day we often misname or even overlook - Shrove Tuesday.

If you are aware of basic history of words and European culture, you will know (or should know) that the word shrove comes from the German word *schreib* which means to scrape and refers to the tradition of going to the sacrament of Confession (where you are scraped clean) as the wonderful season of Lent begins.

Shrove Tuesday marks the initial call to conversion and repentance as Lent begins, and that the beginning of such a process starts with the reminder that we all need to repent and confess our sins.

So where do the pancakes come from?

Lent is a season for fasting, and during Lent it was discouraged to eat eggs and dairy - this led to a mass cupboard clear out on Shrove Tuesday. Rather than waste the food , they were brought together ... hence the simple pancake!

I enjoy pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, and I like to keep them plain and simple - just a little sugar and lemon, or if I'm being fancy a Scotch pancake with a dollop of Strawberry jam, and then I'm ready to begin Lent.

I wonder how do you eat yours?

Are you ready to enter the season of lent?

EUCHARIST (HOLY COMMUNION)

The Eucharist is the source and summit of all
Christian life, the Eucharist is not a thing or a

holy object, the Eucharist is the gift of God Himself given and shared with us.

All parent's of children who will be entering Yr 3 (in September 2025) will be invited from the beginning of May 2025 to enrol their children on the Sacramental Programme.

All children must be baptised in the Catholic Church and families **WILL** be expected, to do what all Catholic families should already be doing, that is attend Sunday Mass.

CONFIRMATION All details will be published in the newsletter and a notice will be sent to our local Diocesan Catholic Secondary School (St. Antony's) and those schools that are in the Diocese of Shrewsbury (BTH, St.

Ambrose & Loreto). Registering an interest is **not** joining the programme, and as the child enters Yr8 (Sept 2025) they will have to make the commitment to participate on the programme and complete the sacraments of initiation. Please not that although information is sent to High Schools outside the Diocese of Salford and the non-Catholic schools in the area, distribution of information is dependant upon the cooperation of the Head teacher and Head of RE.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Code of Canon Law states:
"Parents are obliged to see to it that infants are baptised within the first weeks after birth"


As a Parish, we follow the Diocesan Baptism Policy

In order for your baby/child (under the age of 7) to be baptised, if you are not already practising your Catholic faith, then you must begin to **attend Sunday Mass for a minimum of at least 6 weeks** before a baptism date can be discussed.

- If you live outside the Parish, but this Parish is your place of *regular* worship, no permission is needed.
- If you live outside the Parish and don't regularly attend Mass, permission from your Parish Priest is needed.
- ♦ After a date for baptism has been set, a meeting with Fr. Kieren or Deacon John must be arranged (by you).
- If your child is over 7 they must be treated as an adult and must follow an adapted RCIA programme.
