- **Uniform Reminder:** We currently have some concerns about the length of the skirts of a small number of female pupils. For clarity, skirts should not be rolled up and should end just above the knee and all our pupils will be reminded of this. For most pupils this is usually enough to address the issue, but for a small number of pupils we may insist that they wear trousers to school instead if they are not willing to wear their skirts appropriately.
- **Behaviour updates:** A reminder that if your child intentionally walks away from a C4 or C5 after-school detention without a valid reason, they will be suspended from school for the following day (and possibly more if this is not the first time). We do not want to do this, but believe it is important that pupils take responsibility for their own choices and, thankfully, most pupils now clearly understand this. The parents / carers of all pupils who are suspended from school will have a reintegration meeting with a school leader on their return to discuss the matter further.
- Attendance: Please do everything you can to ensure your child attends school every day. The more days they miss, the more learning they miss which makes it much harder for them to avoid having gaps in their learning. In this half term, we will be providing weekly attendance prizes for all pupils in all year groups, including Fantastic Friday's prize draws
