This letter is regarding the upcoming mock exams and Passport to Prom.

Mock exams: As you know, the final round of mock exams start next week. This is the final practice run before the real exams in summer. The better prepared NAME is for the mock exams, and the more effort they put in, the better they will achieve in summer.

NAME has been provided with an individual exam timetable, a booklet containing revision lists for each subject (link), and a personal revision plan with revision tips (link). The full mock exam timetable is at the end of this letter.

NAME should be revising each day in the lead up to the mock exams and during the mock exam period. Additionally, period 6 and period 0 revision sessions are continuing to run throughout the mock exam period as usual. Independent revision and attendance to revision sessions are both proven to help pupils achieve well.

Passport to Prom: Today, we launched the Year 11 Passport to Prom. Prom is our annual celebration and reward for pupils doing the right thing, day in day out, meaning pupils can get on with learning and teachers can get on with teaching. As explained at the year 11 information evening, prom is invite only subject to meeting certain criteria. We want all pupils to be invited to prom.

To be invited to prom, <u>all</u> of NAME's teachers, (including their form tutor), must give them a **YES**. There will be several opportunities for teachers to give a **YES**. The first will be shortly after the mocks.

To earn a YES in each subject, NAME must:

- Demonstrate good:
 - Effort in mocks
 - Attitude to learning
 - Behaviour
 - Homework
 - Attendance
 - Attendance to intervention (P6, P0 etc)
 - Engagement in form (e.g. revising properly)
- Sit all of their exams

These are all things **NAME** should be doing anyway!
