Dear Parishioners,

It has been a strange week. Although the death of Pope Francis wasn't unexpected, it took us all by surprise; especially as we witnessed him, in his obvious frail condition fulfilled his Petrine ministry as he proclaimed the truth and reality of the Resurrection.

Suddenly, we discovered how important our Catholic faith is, as literally the whole world stopped and focused on Rome. However, as the world focused on the Vatican, the Church in this Easter Octave continued to focus (liturgically at least) on the empty; on the One proclaimed by the successor of Peter. In this Easter season I am sure that Pope Francis would be shaking his head as we focused on him, rather than Him who is the Resurrection.

In the Gospel today, Thomas meets the Risen Lord, and through that encounter his faith is renewed and he spontaneously declares "my Lord and my God". I'm pretty sure that when Pope Francis stands before Jesus, he will certainly say the same. As Francis himself spoke in his first year of his papacy: We believe in the Risen One who conquered evil and death! Let us have the courage to "come out of ourselves" to take this joy and this light to all the places of our life! The Resurrection of Christ is our greatest certainty; he is our most precious treasure! How can we not share this treasure, this certainty with others? It is not only for us, it is to be passed on, to be shared with others. Our testimony is precisely this.

On this Sunday of Easter may we, like Pope Francis pass on and share this truth.



EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION at the last Deanery Conference, it was noted by the Clergy that the Diocese since the pandemic has not provided any updated guidance regrading the role of EMHC. If I discover how to create another day in the week I hope to offer some training after the summer.

In the mean time - can I just thank you all as the points below are a lot of Do Not's - it was suggested that EMHC are reminded of the following:

- Ministry is restricted to within the boundaries of the Parish to which you are commissioned. You should not cross Parish and especially Diocesan boundaries (or enter hospitals) as you are NOT a EMHC outside the Parish.
- 2. If you have been commissioned in the Hospital (Trafford) your ministry is similarly limited, and unless you are commissioned also within the Parish your ministry cannot be exercised.
- 3. If you are bringing the Blessed Sacrament to the sick, you must always receive the sacrament from Parish you are commissioned in.
- 4. You should not remove the Blessed Sacrament from the Tabernacle without informing the Parish Priest.
- 5. When offering a blessing, do not bless with the Host.
- 6. All EMHC must have a valid DBS. If your DBS is no longer in date you must cease exercising your ministry until your DBS can renewed.

THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION EUCHARIST & CONFIRMATION

EUCHARIST (HOLY COMMUNION)

The Eucharist is the source and summit of all Christian life, the Eucharist is not a thing or a holy object, the Eucharist is the gift of God Himself given and shared with us.

All parent's of children who will be entering Yr 3 (in September 2025) will be invited from the beginning of May 2025 to enrol their children on the Sacramental Programme.

All children must be baptised in the Catholic Church and families **WILL** be expected, to do what all Catholic families should already be doing, that is attend Sunday Mass.

confirmation All details will be published in the newsletter and a notice will be sent to our local Diocesan Catholic Secondary School (St. Antony's) and those schools that are in the Diocese of Shrewsbury (BTH, St.

Ambrose & Loreto). Registering an interest is **not** joining the programme, and as the child enters Yr8 (Sept 2025) they will have to make the commitment to participate on the programme and complete the sacraments of initiation. Please not that although information is sent to High Schools outside the Diocese of Salford and the non-Catholic schools in the area, distribution of information is *dependant upon the cooperation of the Head teacher and Head of RE*.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Code of Canon Law states:
"Parents are obliged to see to it that infants are baptised within
the first weeks after birth"
(867)

As a Parish, we follow the Diocesan Baptism Policy

In order for your baby/child (under the age of 7) to be baptised, if you are not already practising your Catholic faith, then you must begin to attend Sunday Mass for a minimum of at least 6 weeks before a baptism date can be discussed.

- If you live outside the Parish, but this Parish is your place of *regular* worship, no permission is needed.
- If you live outside the Parish and don't regularly attend Mass, permission from your Parish Priest is needed.
- After a date for baptism has been set, a meeting with Fr. Kieren or Deacon John must be arranged (by you).
- If your child is aged 7 or over they are treated as an adult and must follow an adapted RCIA programme.
