- Charity fundraising: A huge thank you to all pupils and families who supported our Lenten charity appeals. As a result of our collective efforts we raised £524.49 via our Readathon and £270.35 for St Joseph's Penny. In addition, we collected 120 Easter eggs which we donated to the Cornerstone Centre in Manchester which supports people experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless
- Our values focus in the upcoming half term is **Integrity**. Pupils in years 7-10 will be awarded achievement points when staff see them showing integrity.
- Behaviour updates: Last week our summer term reward trip was launched with all students in years 7-10. Students who earn the highest attitude to learning scores from their teachers this half term will be rewarded with a place on the trip to Blackpool Pleasure Beach on Thursday 10th July. This encompasses areas such as their Super 7 equipment, homework completion, getting involved in their learning in the classroom and their general conduct around school. We hope EVERY child can be part of this trip so please encourage your child to make the correct choices and to focus on making a significant effort in their learning. Good habits such as those detailed above, have a real impact on final grades.
- Please can we remind you that we are a nut free school. Nuts are not permitted at all in school
- **Designated social space for Y7 pupils:** From Mon 28<sup>th</sup> April our Prayer Garden area is going to be open to Y7 pupils at social times so they have a quiet space to sit, chat, read, etc. This will be supervised by a member of staff and there will be no running or ball games.
- Uniform Reminder: We are having a strong drive in this area over the coming weeks as we feel standards have slipped in a small minority. Students have been repeatedly reminded in regards to our standards and this was also in our assemblies last week. Please can we request your support by reminding your child to avoid bringing any jewellery into school as this is not permitted, and also to ensure they took their shirt in with their top buttons done.

- Extremely warm weather: We are aware that the weather could be getting warmer and will communicate directly to parents and students any adaptations that can be made to our uniform as we have done in previous years (e.g. no blazer day or wearing of PE kits).

Additionally, subject leaders are reviewing their homework booklets to improve accessibility for all by simplifying instructions and improving knowledge organisers (including making text bigger!). You will also see, in addition to the quick recall questions, additional challenge/application questions to stretch pupils further and really make them think. Homework is an important part of the 5-year achievement journey in school, designed to help pupils know more, remember more and do more. Thank you for your support with homework.
