FULL STOPS	.	To end a sentence.
CAPITAL LETTERS	Hello	To start a sentence Names, places, titles etc.
COMMAS	,	To separate clauses in a sentence. Use it when you need to take a breath when reading a sentence.
EXCLAMATION MARKS	!	To express a very strong feeling.
QUESTION MARKS	?	To identify a question.
SPEECH MARKS	“ ”	To indicate a speech or a quotation
COLONS	:	To make a list. 'When you go to school, take these items: paper, pencil, pen and a calculator.'
