



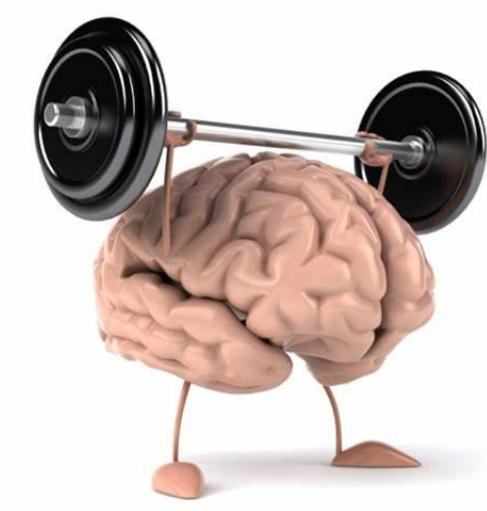

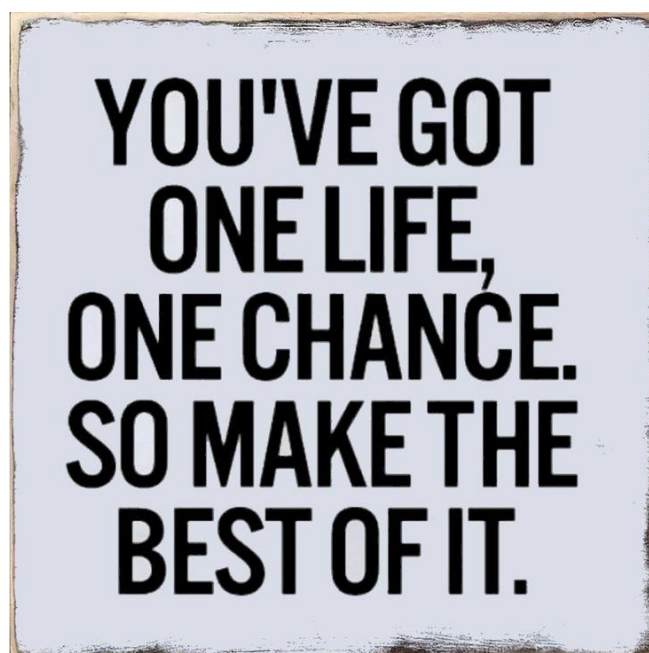

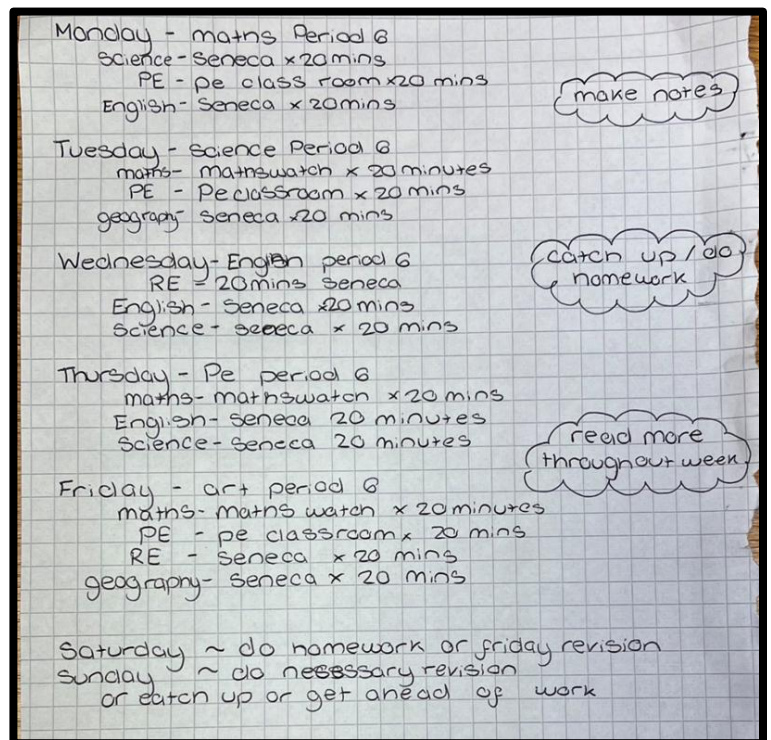

How to make a revision plan

Get organised – make a revision plan, then stick to it!

There are lots of ways to make revision plans. You don't have to use the template in this booklet, but you do need a revision plan to help you be organised and make the most of your time. It also helps lower stress levels when you're organised as you know you have everything covered.

Here are some excellent examples of revision plans made by students from St Antony's.



Key features are:

- You know what you're revising each day.
- Each subject is included.
- P6 and homework are included as they are revision!

Making a revision plan using the template in this booklet

- 1) On the following pages, block off (cross out) any time where revision is not possible, e.g. walking to school, working, clubs, other commitments (P6 and P0 can be included as revision).
- 2) Write in when you will revise (complete homework) for each subject.
- 3) Be realistic, e.g. leave time for breaks, meals etc.
- 4) Complete at least 1 red week and 1 blue week.

Revision Techniques – Train your brain!

Remembering information helps you achieve well. Use a mixture of the following methods to help you remember key knowledge.



Blurting

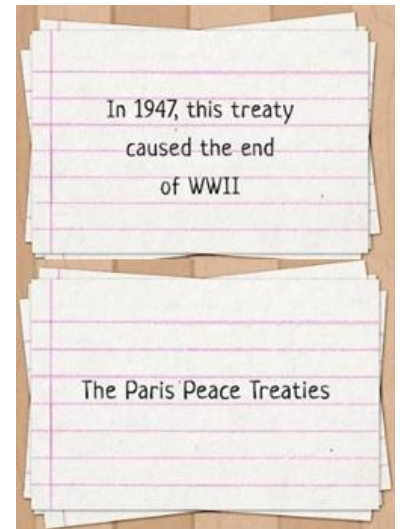
- 1) For 5-10 minutes, **read** the knowledge you need to remember.
- 2) On a blank piece of paper, **write down everything you can remember**.
(Blurt it out!)
- 3) **Compare** your blurted notes with the knowledge you need to remember. **In a different colour pen, add anything you missed**.
- 4) **Spend 5-10 minutes studying your notes, focussing on the bits you didn't remember** (the stuff you wrote in the different coloured pen).
- 5) **Repeat the process. You will remember more each time.**



Flashcards

Flashcards are small, double-sided pieces of card or paper. On one side you write a question or key term. On the other side you write the answer or definition.

- 1) On a piece of paper, draw lines to **divide it into 8**.
- 2) **Cut** along the lines, or **fold and tear** with a ruler.
- 3) For each flashcard, **use your revision guide to write a question/key term** on one side and the **answer/definition** on the other.
- 4) **Practice using them** until you remember everything!



As you work through your flashcards, it is a good idea to separate them into different piles:

- I know this
- Not sure about this
- I don't know this at all

Use these piles to revise more effectively. **Prioritise the cards you don't remember yet and revisit these the most often.**

More ways to revise

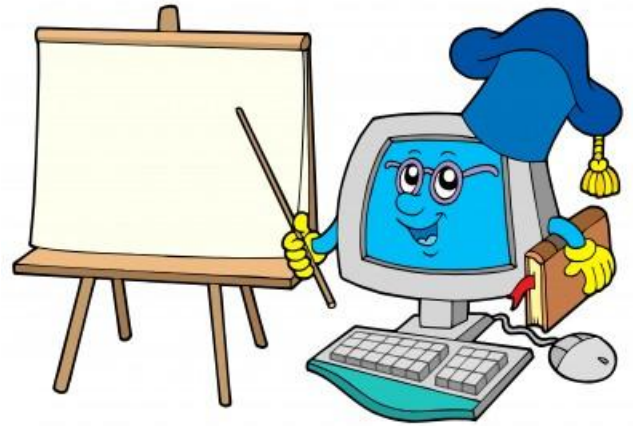
Your homework is your structured revision programme, and everyone must complete it all.

But this is just the minimum. There are lots of other great ways you can revise in addition to your homework.

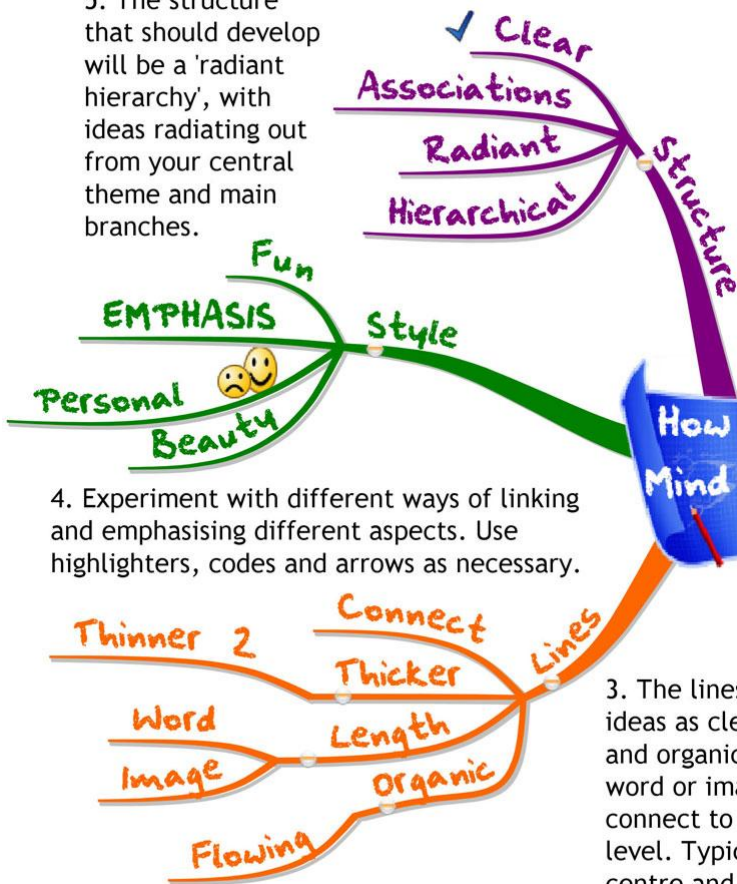
Here are some more ideas:

TEACH FRIENDS/FAMILY

Teaching others is perhaps one of the best ways to actually revise and learn yourself. Get with a group of friends and see who needs help on what topics and teach each other or as a group. You can also grab a friend or family member who doesn't do your course and give them a lesson to help your revision.



5. The structure that should develop will be a 'radiant hierarchy', with ideas radiating out from your central theme and main branches.



1. Start at the centre of a blank, landscape page, ideally with a colourful image to represent your subject.

2. Use words and pictures throughout your map. Wherever possible use single KEY words, printed along a line. Each word or picture sits on its own line.

3. The lines make the associations between ideas as clear as possible. Make them flowing and organic, each line the same length as the word or image. Always ensure that lines connect to the end of the line at the previous level. Typically lines will be thicker at the centre and thinner further out.

4. Experiment with different ways of linking and emphasising different aspects. Use highlighters, codes and arrows as necessary.

Practise answering exam questions

As well as remembering essential knowledge, it's important to practise answering exam questions as this is ultimately what you have to do in your final exams.

Luckily, there are lots of websites available with past papers and mark schemes (answers!)

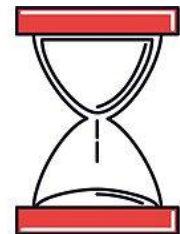
See the list a few pages back (Year 11 Revision Resources) for subject specific websites. To get you started, try the website "Cognito".

Using past papers and mark schemes to revise:

- Either print the past paper and mark scheme or have them open on a screen.
- Read the question (twice).
- Underline any key parts/tasks within the question (paying attention to the number of marks as this gives an idea of how much to write/do).
- Write down your answer to the question.
- Check your answer using the mark scheme and mark it like an examiner would. Tick what you got right, add what you missed in a green pen.
- Repeat until you've finished the paper.
- Read through the paper again, focussing on the green bits.

Revising effectively

- Use a quiet space; no music, TV, phone, or siblings (use school if it helps).
- Be realistic.
- Use your time effectively; no 3-hour blocks without breaks!
- Be determined and stick to the plan, both with revision and breaks.
- Revise in chunks, e.g. 20-40 mins maximum then a short break. Repeat.
- Be kind to yourself during breaks (e.g. hot chocolate, walk the dog).
- Be flexible – if you're on a roll, keep going!
- If your homework is fully up to date, explore other revision methods. You could make mind maps, stick post-it notes around the house on cupboards etc, make revision cards, test your friends, discuss what you've learned, teach your friends and family, practise exam papers and watch revision videos on YouTube. Remember to ask your teachers for help if you are really not sure on something or if you need more revision ideas or materials.
