Watch this video of an example GCSE sketchbook on YouTube. This is how we work in GCSE Art & Design, and at the end of each project we create a 'final piece'.

Read

In Year 10 and 11 we plan to allow you to study in more than one area of Art & Design, e.g. Art & Graphics, or Graphics & Textiles. Over the next few weeks, your work will be set to give you a snapshot of how GCSE work may be. All work at GCSE is completed in class or for homework, there is no written exam for Art, Graphics or Textiles. Instead, your final piece will be created over 10 hours in the classroom. All work is marked by your teachers, and your scores are submitted to the exam board, and then checked by a moderator who visits school.

Do

If you are interested in studying Art & Design you may want to start preparing yourself for further study.

Example tasks you could do:

1. Watch more videos of sketchbooks on YouTube
2. Find Artists and inspiration that you like on Instagram or the internet.
3. Follow our GCSE Art Instagram page, where I am delivering Year 10 learning by setting weekly tasks for our 'Manchester' project. 4. DRAW! The more practise you can get, the better! You can draw objects in your house, copy images, or create images from your imagination.
5. Take interesting photographs of objects and edit them using your phone or Apps. (see highlights on the Instagram page for help!)

Options help!

I have received a lot of questions about the differences between Art, Graphics & Textiles.

In summary:

Art – 'traditional' drawing, painting and image making. You don't need to necessarily be 'good' at drawing realistic images, but you must be creative and willing to try a range of techniques. You will develop skills in a broad range of media.

Graphic Communication – Communicating messages through images and text. This is very good if you are interested in photography, branding, digital design, logos, fashion, illustration, magazines, interior design and advertising.

Textiles – Art that uses fabrics and fibres. This is particularly good if you are interested in fashion, interior design, printmaking, craft and sewing.

Tasks for this week:

Fashion illustrator, Niki Groom has been inspired by the display of rainbows in peoples' homes to create her artwork 'stay safe'. (see the image below)

Using this as inspiration, create a response to the stay safe campaign using rainbows as a theme.

Choose **one** of the following and create it in any means you can (drawing/painting/3D):

- Art
 - An illustration of a range of interesting objects at home, e.g. vase/bottle/toys
 - A drawing of a street of houses inspired by Niki Groom
 - A drawing to show the idea of staying at home e.g. a window / garden / baking / cake
- Graphics
 - Design a hoodie that promotes the idea of staying home.
 - Design a pair of trainers for your favourite brand that would be sold to raise money for the NHS. You could design the trainers, packaging and an advert
 - Design a fun board game to be played by families to promote the idea of 'social media distancing' to encourage families away from their screens.
- Textiles
 - Create a range of designs for T-shirts that promote staying at home
 - Design a cushion that could be sold to raise money for charity
 - Create a range of fashion illustrations inspired by Niki Groom


