GCSE Art & Design: Textiles



Course Content:

GCSE Art & Design: Textiles is a creative and practical subject. Students work on two units of study, beginning in Year 10 to produce a portfolio of work for evidence. They will explore a range of existing textiles work as a basis for developing their own personal projects in response to set briefs. Skills will be developed in drawing, painting, sewing (hand and machine) and fabric manipulation techniques to produce a final textiles product for each project.

Skills needed and developed:

You will need to develop a comprehensive portfolio showing large amounts of developments, studies and ideas. In order to do this, you must be:

- Creative –Textiles is as much about ideas as it is about the skills to translate them into a final piece. You must be able to work independently and have creative ideas.
- Resilient In Textiles there are no set answers, you **create** them.
- Dedicated There is a lot of work to do, you must be committed to your studies.

Assessment Methods:

Unit 1 Portfolio (60%): You will create a portfolio of work over 2 years in response to a range of Art & Design briefs. There are no time constraints when creating your portfolio, however there will be strict deadlines. You have to show you have met the 4 Assessment Objectives which require you to work through a comprehensive project from brief, ideas, exploration, development and final personal response.

Unit 2 Externally Set Task (40%): In January of Year 11 you will be given a range of externally set tasks from the exam board. You will need to respond to your chosen brief through the same Assessment Objectives as Unit 1. You will have 10 hours to create your final response, supported by preparatory time.

Qualification gained at completion of the course:

You will achieve a single award GCSE in Art & Design: Textiles
