Background:

On 8 May 1945 the Germans surrendered to the Allied powers. War in Europe, which began in 1939, finally came to an end. This is known as Victory in Europe Day – or VE Day for short. 8 May 2020 marked the 75th Anniversary of VE Day, which is why it featured in the news so much last week.
