

2) Read this text:

The end of public executions

The Bloody Code was based on the idea that harsh punishments deterred criminals. Executions were made public events, and were supposed to be a spectacle that people would fear. However, in many cases executions attracted large crowds and there was a carnival atmosphere. In some towns, special train services were laid on to bring large numbers to the execution site, and some employers allowed workers time off to attend. Local traders and shopkeepers enjoyed extra trade on hanging days, which were treated as festive occasions.

Increasingly, reformers argued that public execution was inhumane, and that those condemned to death should

have more dignity during their execution.

Other concerns surrounding public executions were that:

- the crowds that came to watch were often drunk and disorderly
- for most spectators, public executions were a fun spectacle, rather than a solemn occasion that would scare them into being law-abiding
- sometimes the crowds seemed to mock the authorities and treat the condemned criminal as a hero
- the large crowds that gathered at executions provided opportunities for further crimes, including pickpocketing and prostitution.

Public executions were stopped in 1868. Executions still took place but they were carried out away from public view.
