- You cannot marry a person from a different faith.


- Homeless people should not be helped

Create an information sheet why he is so important when discussing Christianity and human rights. You must include: At least 10 facts

Desmond TuTu spoke out against Apartheid in South Africa, gaining support from around the world. He worked in South Africa as a Bishop in many places and he was spokesperson for all African churches.

Desmond was the first black archbishop, won the noble peace prize, honour of introducing Nelson Mandella as president of South Africa. He worked hard throughout his life to stop segregation in South Africa

WORKSHEET THREE:

Human rights are important to Catholics and many Catholic principles are mirrored within human rights.

They are important to Catholics for three reasons:

1. They believe every human being is created by God in his image and deserves respect.
2. They believe God loves everyone equally so all should be treated equally.

Task 2 What would a Catholic do?

Using your knowledge from task 1 reflect on the situations below and decide how a Catholic would respond in each situation. Aim to use a Christian teaching or parable in each box as evidence for your answer. *E.g. A Catholic would... This is because...*

Lifestyles

There is a huge difference in people's lifestyles across the world, while some people have more money than they will ever be able to spend, others don't have a home and live on the street; they go hungry and are denied basic rights.

Genocide

During the Holocaust over six millions Jews were starved, tortured and then murdered by the Nazi Party. The only reason for this was being born Jewish.

Asylum seekers

There is a growing population of asylum seekers in a local community. They are subject to racist comments and abuse from other members of the community.

Education

Many children around the world are denied the right to education as they live in poorer communities.

Apartheid

In the first half of this century black and white people were segregated in America. Black people were seen as inferior and were not allowed to use the same shops, public toilets and schools as whites.

Death Penalty

In 58 countries around the world the death penalty is used as a form of punishment for crimes such as murder, treason, rape, aggravated robbery and drug trafficking.
