


Reasons to choose St Antony's Roman Catholic School






Meet our Head Boys and Girls

Transition and Support

We pride ourselves on working in partnership with parents and primary schools to ensure that a students' transition to us is a positive experience. We hold a number of events before your son/daughter joins us to ensure that they feel comfortable and enthused. This includes open evenings, new parent evenings and transition days. We attend a number of events at local primary schools too. We welcome you to arrange a personal tour of the school at any stage and understand that for some students, this might be a number of visits to ease them into the school.

In Year 7

We work hard to ensure that your son/daughter settles quickly into Year 7 and makes friends quickly. In the first few weeks of induction, students will spend time finding their way round the school, joining extracurricular classes and getting to know their form group. We offer pastoral support to those students who need some extra help and our school Student Leadership Team and Peer Mentors support the process of new students settling into school life.





Learning Support

At St Antony's we adhere to three main principles to ensure that all students can access a broad and balanced curriculum and have an equal opportunity to receive an education that is appropriate to their individual needs by:

Setting suitable learning challenges

We work to give every student the opportunity to experience success in learning and to achieve as high-a-standard as possible by appropriate intervention and support.

Responding to students diverse learning needs

When we plan our lessons we take into account the different backgrounds, experiences, interests and strengths which influence the way in which students learn.

Overcoming potential barriers to learning and assessment

We recognise that a minority of students will have particular learning and assessment requirements and do our best to address them by relevant support during lesson time and examination time (if appropriate).



How do we do this?

Where appropriate, our team of Learning Support Assistants will work with students either in the classroom environment, in small groups or on a one-to-one basis. This support can take many forms including inside and outside of the classroom help. We welcome you to discuss this with us personally so that we can build the appropriate support for your son/daughter.

High Expectations

Everyone has high expectations of each other at St Antony's. This makes for a conducive and happy learning environment.

Attendance

It is essential for confidence and continuity that students have high attendance. You can read more about this in our Attendance Policy.







Our students really value the extra-curricular clubs that are on offer during lunch-time and after the school day. These clubs enable our students to gain new skills, take part in their favourite sport, develop a wider group of friends and have fun. School Buses

There are two services that are specifically for our school students. These bring students direct to the school and take the same journey back at the end of the day. These are operated by external providers and take the following routes.

Service 785 route: From Hulme, Royce Road/City Road via City Road, Northumberland Road, Ayres Road, Seymour Grove, Kings Road, Great Stone Road, Chester Road, Davyhulme Road East, Moss Road, Derbyshire Lane, Barton Road, Chatsworth Road, Winchester Road, Moss Vale Road, Bradfield Road to St Antony's Roman Catholic School.

Service 786 route: From Flixton, Towns Gate via Irlam Road, Woodsend Crescent Road, Moorside Road, Winchester Road, Moss Vale Road, Bradfield Road to St Antony's Roman Catholic School.
