



Re: GCSE Results Day 2020 – Thursday 20th August

Dear Year 11,

We hope that you and your families are staying safe and well and that you enjoyed the messages from your form tutors recently!

We wanted to give you an update on the situation for your GCSE results. This infographic has come from JCQ who are in charge of the examinations and outlines what has already happened (Phase 1), what is currently happening (Phase 2) and what will happen (Phase 3 – Results Day).



JCQ **GCSE, AS, A levels and VQs 2020: How it works**

Phase 1: Schools and Colleges
Schools and colleges have submitted to exam boards the centre assessed grades teachers think you would have received had you sat the exam.
Teachers also submitted a rank order for you based on how you were expected to perform in each subject.
Teachers used information such as your coursework, mock exams, assessments, general records and performance throughout each course to determine your grade and ranking.

Phase 2: Exam Board Checks
Exam boards are now checking grades for consistency using a model developed with regulators.
They are working hard to make sure grades are awarded fairly and in line with previous national results in each subject, how well this year's students have performed previously and how well the school or college has performed in recent years.

Phase 3: Results Days
AS and A Levels: 13th August
GCSEs: 20th August
Results released at 8am!
This is the moment you've been waiting for! Even though you didn't have the exam experience, you can be confident that the grades reflect your work and have been awarded as fairly as possible to ensure you're ready to take the next step in your education.

On Thursday 20th August you can receive your GCSE exam results. Given the current situation, it will be necessary to make some changes to the usual way in which Results Day is carried out. We have allocated half hour arrival times for each form class and they are as follows:

If you are late for your allocated time, you may arrive between 11.00-11.30am to collect your results.

Unfortunately, you will not be able to stay in school for any prolonged period of time when you collect your results.

Mrs Doherty has already been in touch with Year 11 to state that it is possible not to collect your results in person if you prefer and we are very aware that more of you may choose to use this option this year. If you are not collecting your results in person, you can:

- Leave a **stamped addressed envelope** at Reception **before 23rd July** for the attention of Mrs Harris, with a **signed note** inside stating that you want your results posting to you
- Leave a **signed note** for the attention of Mrs Harris at Reception **before 23rd July**, stating that you will not be collecting your results yourself and **stating the name of the person** you authorise us to pass your results to in your place
- Leave a **signed note** at Reception for the attention of Mrs Harris **before 23rd July**, stating that you wish your results to be emailed to you and **your email address** that you would like used for this

In all cases, please note that the results belong to you and we are not permitted to give them to anyone other than you without your signed permission.

We will provide you with any relevant released JCQ information on Results Day, including appeals.

In the meantime, stay safe and well and we look forward to seeing you or hearing from you.
